year ago today, May 22, 2018, I began a series of six chemotherapy treatments over four months to combat stage 2 Hodgkin's lymphoma. Within two weeks my hair

was gone and my intolerance for the summer heat meant that I would spend most of those days indoors. Other side-effects would come and go. I learned many lessons during that time and a new insight into the term "longsuffering."

I am grateful for the love and care offered by my family and from this church. The prayers, notes, meals and numerous expressions of faith, hope, and love sustained Gay, I and the children through the process. You carried us when we needed to be

encouraged us when we needed to be encouraged and celebrated with us when we got the good news of being "cancer free." Paul put it this way in 1 Corinthians 12, "If one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it." You were the church, the Body of Christ, to us in our time of need and we will forever be thankful.

It is surreal to consider myself a "cancer survivor," but this experience is now part of my story and will always be part of my life's journey. I will go to the hospital every six weeks to have my port flushed. Every 12 weeks I will have blood drawn and see my oncologist. PET scans will be each December.

This "maintenance" will go on for two years at which point my doctor says we will make a new plan for the next three years. Basically, for the next five years I will be under a routine of doctor's care.

I consider myself to be fortunate, however, for the critical part of my battle with cancer was only four months. Many others battle for years through the pain of cancers, tumors,

chemotherapy and radiation. Some fight a battle that they cannot ultimately win, reminding us that cancer continues to be a deadly foe.

And for each of these, we have the chance to be the "Body of Christ." We must come alongside all those who suffer. We must offer faith, hope and love through our prayers and our acts of grace and kindness.

I am looking forward to a wonderful summer of life and ministry at First Baptist. Our youth will be at Falls Creek the first two weeks of June. Our children will enjoy F.I.S.H camps throughout June as well as Summerscope, gymnastics camp and chef's camps. Pops in the Park is June 23 and Family Serve Day, June 29. And of course, June is the prelude to the rest of the summer with the Youth Mission trip to Watonga, Vacation Bible School, S.M.A.K and Collegiate Week at Falls Creek.

In order for all of these ministries and outreach events to be successful, we must each find our place to serve


and get involved.
