can be confident that God is working all things together for His good. Verse 29 tells us that "His good" is that we become conformed to the image of Christ. In other words, God is working in the midst of the good and





FBC MISSIONS SPOTLIGHT ELAM MINISTRIES

Elam has been working in and around Iran since 1990. Their vision is that all the people of the Iran region would have the opportunity to come to know the Lord Jesus Christ and follow Him as a disciple and that Iranians would be instrumental in taking the Gospel to other Muslims. To achieve this vision, they:

- Train leaders for fruitful, effective ministry in the Iran region.
- Equip the Iranian church with Bibles and resources for evangelism and discipleship.
- Send the Gospel into the Iran region through trained evangelists, church planters, and Christian media.

On Easter Sunday, more than 2,000 Persian-speaking households from across Iran and the surrounding region tuned into an Easter worship service, which was streamed through multiple platforms. That's expected to be the largest number of Persian-speaking believers that have gathered together for worship at Easter in living memory.

Such is the openness of the Iranian people that wherever there is a witness to the Gospel, individuals, families, and even communities are coming to Christ.

Over the years, Elam has given our Friendship International Ministry several Persian Bibles to share with our students. Through the mission portion of our church budget, we assist Elam in purchasing and distributing Bibles and providing Discipleship Training in the Iran region.


