I look forward to Sunday, June 7, when we gather at 10:30 a.m. in our Sanctuary to worship. It will be wonderful to see many of you again. As we anticipate that day, your ministry team has been planning and preparing. Below are the guidelines put into place so that we can come together in as safe a way as possible.

RSVP FOR WORSHIP

Please go to our website or call the church office to let us know you are coming and how many will be worshiping with you. We will practice social distancing in the sanctuary as we sit by households or individually. We believe we can accommodate everyone in a single service, but need to know our numbers beforehand. Unregistered guests will need to register at the door and may be delayed entering the sanctuary.

DOORS OPEN AT 10:00 A.M.

We are working to provide a "No Touch" entry into the church and sanctuary. Please check-in at the office or breezeway entrances and make your way to the sanctuary. We will seat the sanctuary from back to front, sitting in designated pews. Seating in the balcony will be available on the second and fourth rows, skipping three seats between households. A limited number of pew chairs will be available for those with specific seating and mobility needs. Ushers will help you find your seat and please understand that you may not be able to sit in your usual seat.

FACE MASKS AND SOCIAL DISTANCING

We ask everyone to wear a face mask upon entering and exiting the church and when in the hallways and restrooms. Also, there has been much concern expressed surrounding choral and congregational singing. Thus, we will delay the return of our choir and orchestra in worship and ask that during the music portion of worship the congregation wear face masks. We will not be seating in the section immediately in front of the platform so that those on the platform will be able to lead without their face masks. FAMILY WORSHIP

ADDITIONAL ACCOMMODATIONS

No worship programs/bulletins. All items have been removed from the pew racks.

Offering boxes will be available to put your offerings in before/after worship.

Water fountains and coffee stations will not be available.

Sanitary wipes will be provided in restrooms.

Hand sanitizers and face masks will be readily available.

Basement, children's, preschool and youth areas will be closed.

Worship service will be less than 1 hour. We will dismiss by row after worship.

Please gather outside after worship for fellowship, maintaining social distance.

LIFEGROUPS

At this time, we will not resume LifeGroups at the church on Sunday morning. We encourage you to continue to meet by Zoom and connect with each other as you are able. Individual LifeGroups that would like to begin meeting again at the church can call the church office and make a reservation for a limited number of rooms that are being prepared to accommodate social distancing.

ONLINE WORSHIP

We will continue to have online worship each Sunday at 10:30 a.m. We encourage those over 65 and with underlying health issues to continue to be patient, stay at home and worship online.

In addition to resuming worship on June 7, please know that Summerscope is underway for another summer of ministry and that the FLC is open with limited hours, taking reservations for those wishing to use the walking track, game room and fitness room. The playground is open in the evenings. Children's and youth ministries are resuming as well. Evening Prayers is each Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. through Zoom. We look forward to more things starting back up over these weeks of summer.

Over the past year we have spent a great deal of time focusing on our Lord's command to "love one another as He loved us." As we come together in worship and ministry, we have the opportunity to model this love as an example to our community — they will know we are Christians by our love for one another. So, let us continue to be patient and care for one another, practicing these safeguards as acts of love and hospitality.
