As part of our ministry to our community, First Baptist provides financial support to organizations in Norman who work with individuals, families and children. This month we contributed to Food and Shelter, 201 Reed Ave., www.foodandshelterinc.org.

Food and Shelter was founded in 1983 by a group of compassionate members of McFarlin Memorial United Methodist Church lead by Harriet Leigh and Kathryn Selmon.

They began distributing meals to hungry people in community parks but soon it became clear the need was greater than anticipated and McFarlin UMC brought in a coalition of volunteers to expand services.

In 1987, Food for Friends opened in their original location at 104 W. Comanche St. which is where services were located until the new campus opened in 2017.

# FBC Missions Ministry Spotlight — Tammie and Kell Haworth

Thanks to your regular tithes and offerings to FBC, we can provide Kell and Tammy Haworth support as one of our mission partners.

Tammie and Kell Haworth, FBC-Norman members and full-time missionaries with No Boundaries International, primarily work in an area of Oklahoma City that is known for human trafficking (Capitol Hill).

"Though we are involved in antihuman trafficking, we believe that dying without knowing Jesus is the greatest human tragedy of all. With our hearts broken for victims of human trafficking, we strive to carry the torch of evangelism wherever we go. We are called to share the love and true nature of Christ to the broken and hurting of all walks of life. We do this through occupational therapy, pastoral care, outreaches of compassion, and evangelistic preaching," Kell said.

NBI has a sensory room in one of its Capitol Hill locations where Tammie uses her skills, as an occupational therapy professional, to provide pro bono services to neighborhood children who have sensory issues.

"She also has been providing services for someone who was first trafficked at the age of 14. The good news is that not only has this person been freed from trafficking, but has also started their own ministry, even while dealing with their past trauma," Kell said.

Both Tammie and Kell are planning mission trips to NYC and internationally, once COVID-19 restrictions allow.
